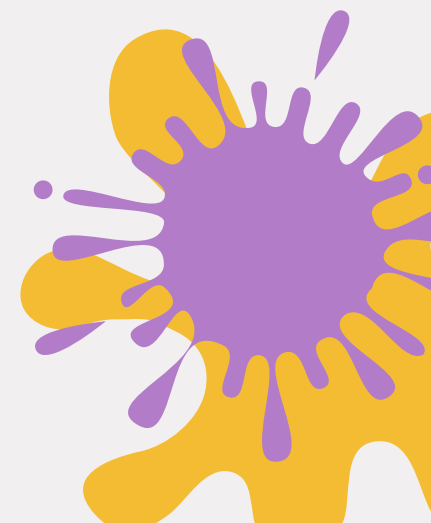
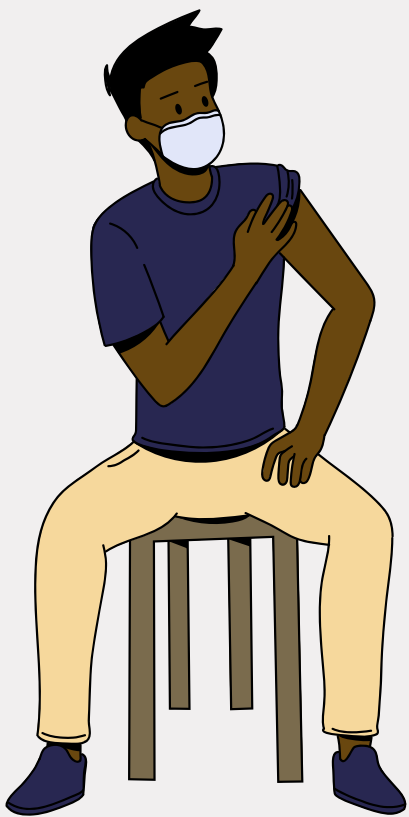


why get vaccinated?



Vaccines work and are free. All authorised vaccines are recommended and safe.

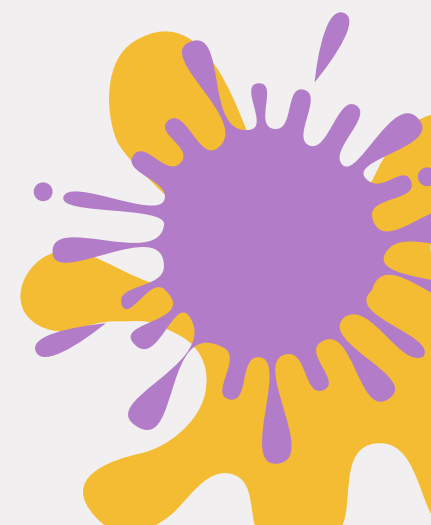
Vaccination is not compulsory, but is necessary to protect as many people as possible.



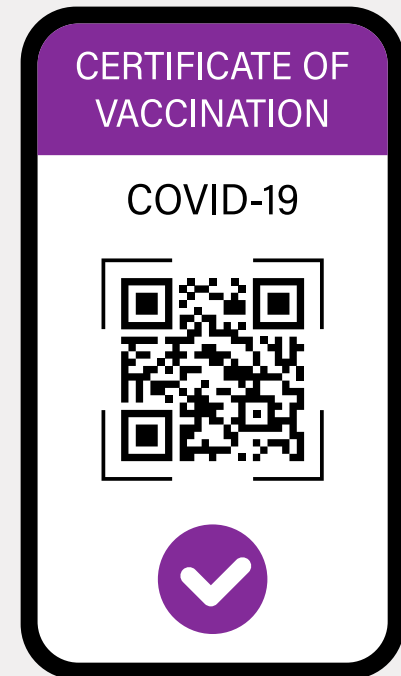
What is a green pass?



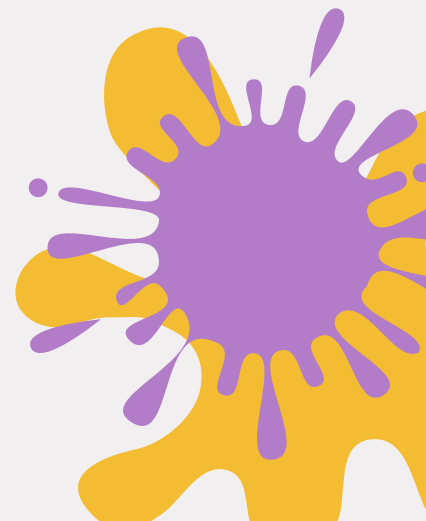
It is a digital, printable certification stating that you have been vaccinated, have tested negative for rapid molecular or antigenic testing within the last 48 hours, or have been cured of COVID-19 within the last six months, **It is necessary in order to access events and structures in Italy and to facilitate travel in Europe.**



How do you get the green pass?



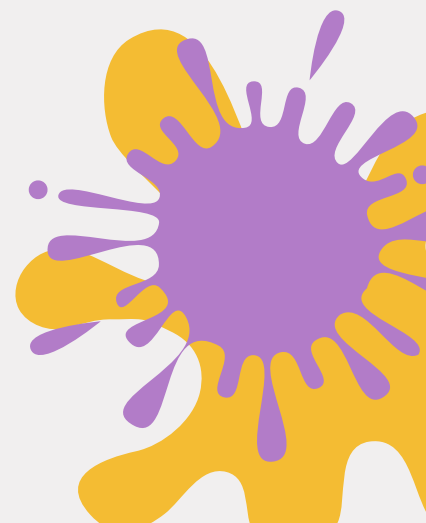
You can view, download and print the Certificate through the following digital platforms: **Ministry of Health website, electronic health record, Applmmuni or AppIO.**



What to do if I don't have digital tools?



If you do not have a digital device (computer or smartphone), you can contact your general practitioner, paediatrician or pharmacy to retrieve your COVID-19 Green Certification.
